## **Program Outline**

The Patroller Program is managed nationally for the CSP by an education committee comprised of members from across the country. This committee is headed by the National VP of Education and they are responsible to the Medical Advisory Committee for ensuring that appropriate training is provided in accordance with accepted medical and first aid practices.

While the implementation of the program may vary slightly locally based on resort specific requirements and provincial legislation, the following is a list of topics that are taught to all members across Canada:
